Bridge Loop Ride

Mandjoogoordap - meeting place of the heart

Discover Mandurah's rich history and natural beauty with the bridge loop ride. Starting and finishing at the Mandurah Visitor Centre this 10km loop provides a taste of Mandurah's relaxed nature, heritage, and picturesque waterways.

General Information

This cycle trail covers the highlights of Mandurah's history and natural beauty.

Distance

Approx. 10km.

Duration

Approx. 40 minutes of riding time, allow additional time for stops along the way.

Difficulty

The trail is generally flat bike path or on road cycling lanes.

Bike Hire

Visit the Mandurah Visitor Centre to discuss your e-bike and e-scooter hire options.

Parking

Free parking is available throughout the City of Mandurah.

Transport

Mandurah can be reached by car, train or bus and provides access to bike hire facilities.

Travel Tips

- All bike paths on this route are 'shared paths'. Please give way to pedestrians at all times.
- · Ride single file on bike paths.
- Ring your bell if approaching pedestrians from behind.
- Be alert and courteous at all times.
- Bring water bottles. You can fill them up along the trail.
- Most importantly enjoy the sights of Mandurah.

Trail Notes

Mandurah is the perfect city to explore by bike, it is mostly flat terrain and there are plenty of shared paths and dedicated cycle lanes. Start your journey at the Mandurah Visitor Centre.

1. Mandurah Visitor Centre

• From the Mandurah Visitor Centre, after you have checked out the amazing 'Welcome to Country' mural by artists Peta & Corey Ugle inside the Mandurah Visitor Centre, head south along the Eastern Foreshore (2).

2. Mandurah Eastern Foreshore

- Ride along the Eastern Foreshore stopping at the playground, the Heart sculpture and the Kwillena Gabi Estuary Pool. Continue south until you reach Tuckey Lane (in between 5 and 8 Mandurah Tce) where you will find the Floral Swing Mural.
- Continue south along the Eastern Foreshore and under the Mandurah Bridge (Pinjarra Road). After you emerge on the other side of the bridge, take a left to reach the Mandurah Community Museum (3).

Mandurah Community Museum

 Head back to the Foreshore and continue south (parallel to Soldiers Cove Tce). At the end of Soldiers Cove Tce, take a left onto Heron St. At the end of Heron St, turn right onto Leslie St. Take a right onto Waterside Dr and follow until you reach the cycle path that takes you under the Mandurah Rd bridge. Once on the other side of the bridge take a left to arrive at Osprey Park (4).

4. Osprey Park

Cycle north along the pathway.
 Cross Egret Point Rd into Samphire
 Cove Reserve. Spend some time
 cycling/walking around the
 pathways of Samphire Cove (5).

5. Samphire Cove

Travel along Egret Point Rd, which will turn into Leisure Way. Just before reaching Old Coast Rd, turn right onto the pathway that runs parallel. Cross Leeward Entrance and take a left to cross over Old Coast Rd. Continue north along the pathway that runs parallel to Old Coast Rd. After crossing over the canals on your left will be Sutton's Homestead (6).

6. Sutton's Homestead

Continue your journey north.
 Cross over Mary St into the Western Foreshore. Head left along the pathway. On your left, just after Amity Cove, you will find Hall's Cottage (7).

7. Hall's Cottage

 Jump back onto the path and follow until the end, take a left and cross through the Western Foreshore carpark. Here you will find the War Memorial (8).

8. Mandurah War Memorial

 Head back to the carpark, but before crossing over the carpark take a left and travel south along the path in front of the waters edge. This path will take you to the Meeting Place artwork (9) next to the Skate park.

9. Meeting Place Artwork

 Turn left onto the Western end of the bridge's footpath where you'll find a 'Welcome to Country' translated into English. Cross the bridge back to the Eastern Foreshore.

10. Mandurah Bridge

 Once on the Eastern Foreshore side of the bridge, you'll find the Noongar version of the 'Welcome to Country'.



Mandurah Visitor Centre

Speak to the experts at the Mandurah Visitor Centre. They can help you with maps, bookings and provide local knowledge.

Discover the magnificent 'Welcome to Country' mural on the wall of the Mandurah Visitor Centre telling the Aboriginal creation story of Mandjoogoordap (Mandurah).



Mandurah Eastern Foreshore

Cycle alongside the estuary. Stop along the way at the kids playground, shady picnic spots and/or utilise the BBQ facilities.

Get Instagramming with the 3D Art including 'The Heart' and 'Floral Swing Mural'.

Mandurah Community Museum

Get a fascinating glimpse into Mandurah's history and learn about significant people, places and events.

Entry is by gold coin donation. Open Tuesday to Sunday.

Osprey Park

This big adventure and naturebased playground is located on the waters edge and is the perfect place to play, picnic, BBQ and even fish. There's also a sandy beach perfect for having a splash.



Samphire Cove

Located on the north-western side of the Peel Inlet, the reserve includes scenic boardwalks, two bird hides and an information shelter.

Sutton's Homestead

A charming little cottage built in 1881, that showcases what it was like in the old days.



Hall's Cottage

Built in the early 1830s by Henry Edward Hall who was the first person to develop a fishing industry in Mandurah.

Mandurah Community Museum

The museum located in Hall's Cottage is open on Sundays.

Mandurah War Memorial

Designed by award winning architects Hames Sharley in 2005. The monument symbolises events at ANZAC Cove.



Meeting Place

Mandurah's traditional name 'Mandjoogoordap' means 'meeting place of the heart'. The 8-metre-tall artwork reflects Mandurah's identity and celebrates the connection people have to the Old Bridge, the estuary and the waterways.

Mandurah Bridge

Originally built in 1894, then rebuilt in 1954 and then completely replaced in 2017. The Mandurah Bridge on Pinjarra Road is an iconic local landmark.
