Mandjoogoordap – meeting place of the heart

From parks and reserves, to the marina and coast explore the highlights of Mandurah on a relaxing 15km ride. With plenty of places to stop and take a break this is the perfect day out for the family. Bring your bathers for a dip along the way.

General Information

This cycle trail covers the highlights of Mandurah with plenty of reserves and parks to stop at along the way.

Distance

Approx. 15km.

Duration

Approx. 60 mins of riding time, allow additional time for stops along the way.

Difficulty

The trail is generally flat bike path or on road cycling lanes.

Bike Hire

Visit the Mandurah Visitor Centre to discuss your e-bike and e-scooter hire options.

Parking

Free parking is available throughout the City of Mandurah.

Transport

Mandurah can be reached by car, train or bus and provides access to bike hire facilities.

Travel Tips

- All bike paths on this route are 'shared paths'. Please give way to pedestrians at all times.
- Ride single file on bike paths.
- Ring your bell if approaching pedestrians from behind.
- Be alert and courteous at all times.
- Bring water bottles. You can fill them up along the trail.
- Most importantly enjoy the sights of Mandurah.

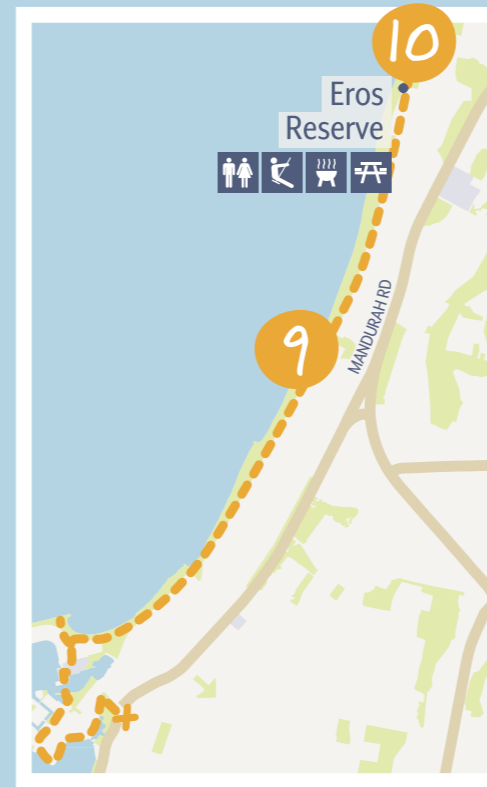

MANDURAH

Trail Notes

This trail follows on road paths and bike paths through Mandurah's Ocean Marina and along its northern coast. Start your journey at the Mandurah Visitor Centre and enjoy the city's picturesque parks, and stunning views of the Indian Ocean with plenty of opportunities to stop along the way.

1. Mandurah Visitor Centre

- From the Mandurah Visitor Centre continue heading along the boardwalk.
- Along the boardwalk, to your right, you'll find The Frame (near Mandurah Boat Hire) (2)

2. The Frame

- Continue along the boardwalk, past The Sebel Mandurah, until you reach Stingray Point (3). Here you will find a large Moreton Bay fig tree and a restored gazebo.

3. Stingray Point

- Continue your journey past Stingray Point. After the carpark take the path to your right, then turn left along the path to travel down Vivaldi Dr.
- Take a quick right to travel down Dorsodura Way which will turn into San Polo Vista. Cross over Marco Polo Dr and follow the path that runs parallel to The Lido. At the end of The Lido you will find the Dolphin Quay Beach and Keith Holmes Reserve (4).

4. Keith Holmes Reserve

- In between the Beach and the playground you will find the path that crosses over the water into Mandurah Ocean Marina (5). On your left you will find Boardwalk @ DQ where you can get a photo with giant marine wildlife art.

5. Mandurah Ocean Marina

- Continue along Zephyr Mews. Once you come to the roundabout you will see the blue gatehouse to the marina with 3D Art, for more Instagram content (6).

6. Blue Gatehouse Pelican 3D Art

- Follow the waters edge along Spinnaker Quays. Follow Spinnaker Quays to the end, loop around towards the ocean. Cross over Breakwater Parade and to your right you will find the Fairy Tern Sanctuary (7).

7. Mandurah Fairy Tern Sanctuary

- Continue on the path to Town Beach (8). Stop at the little playground (where the carpark is). There are also a number of undercover shades on the sand.

8. Town Beach

- Continue up the coast along the water. The path will come to an end at Stewart St. Turn right onto Stewart St, then left onto Ormsby Tce.
- Follow Ormsby Tce until you reach the roundabout. Cross over the roundabout and to your left you will find Henson Park (9). Stop here for a play at the playground.

9. Henson Park

- Follow the path that runs along the beach, taking your first right, after the bend, continuing down Ormsby Tce. Continue along this path, past Silver Sands Beach until you reach the end of the path. You will come out onto Acheron Rd. Turn left and follow the path that bends around, turning back into Ormsby Tce.
- Follow Ormsby Tce until it starts to bend and turns into Eros Pl. Here you will find Eros Reserve and Tide Café (next to the Surf Life Saving Club).

10. Eros Reserve

- Follow the directions in reverse order to get back to the Mandurah Visitor Centre (1).

A footbridge leads over to the Mandurah Ocean Marina where you can find lots of waterside cafes, restaurants and takeaway options.



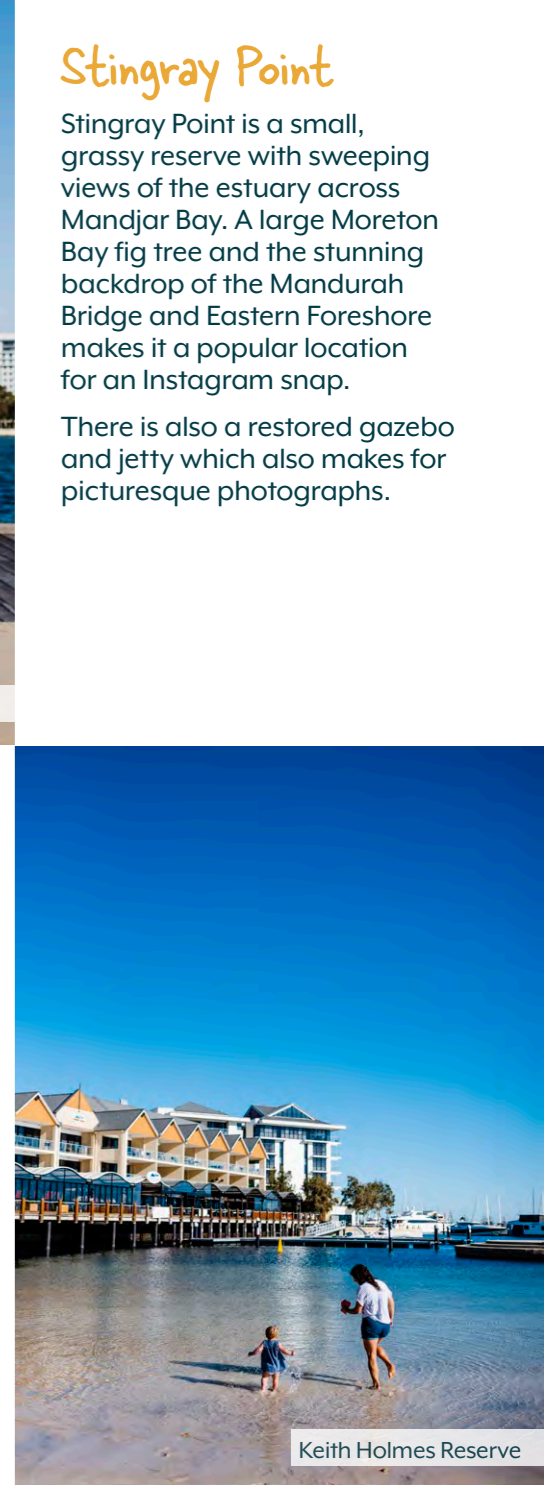
Stingray Point

Mandurah Fairy Tern Sanctuary

A nesting sanctuary to help protect the threatened species. Find out more about the vulnerable birdlife with educational signs at the sanctuary.

Stingray Point

Stingray Point is a small, grassy reserve with sweeping views of the estuary across Mandjar Bay. A large Moreton Bay fig tree and the stunning backdrop of the Mandurah Bridge and Eastern Foreshore makes it a popular location for an Instagram snap.

There is also a restored gazebo and jetty which also makes for picturesque photographs.

Henson Park

Take a breath and make use of the picnic tables. There is also a playground and grassed area.

Eros Reserve

Located next to the Mandurah Surf Life Saving Club, the reserve includes a playground, BBQ area, a beach volleyball court. Hungry? Why not grab a bite to eat at Tides Café.
